Because we know that it's not intellectual disability that prevents success – it's lack of opportunity.

While we have made great strides in delivering on our mission, the pandemic was a stark reminder of how critical our programs are to the physical, mental and emotional well-being of our athletes. We entered 2021 with a heightened sense of purpose and focus on recovering and rebuilding our movement. It is thanks to the dedication of volunteers, coaches, partners, staff and supporters that we saw significant progress in a return to in-person programs across the country.

While this was a year of rebuilding, we are proud to share the many successes and inspiring stories in this report. You will see how Canadians embraced inclusion through awareness initiatives, how we improved the quality of our programs and Safe Sport training and how the longest serving Special Olympics Team Canada inspired us all with their perseverance, determination and resiliency. The national awareness and recruitment campaign 'Our Podium' shone a spotlight on Special Olympics athletes, coaches and volunteers who live the true meaning of sport every day and inspire others to get involved in our inclusive community where we elevate each other. Our National Partners joined our rebuilding efforts through increased support in a variety of initiatives throughout the year. And most notably, the Government of Canada announced the inclusion of Special Olympics Canada in the 2022 federal budget.

## Our Podium Campaign

As with all national sport organizations, Special Olympics Canada saw a significant decrease in active registrants during the pandemic, due to the suspension of in-person programming and the postponement or cancellation of competition.

As restrictions began to lift and in-person programs began to safely re-open across the country, Special Olympics Canada prioritized the re-engagement of our athletes and volunteers. To inspire new athletes, coaches and volunteers to join the movement, we launched a national awareness and recruitment campaign.

The campaign asked the question, “What if sport was about more than winning? What if ‘being a winner’ meant something completely different?” At Special Olympics, our athletes, volunteers and coaches live the true meaning of sport every day, redefining what it means to win. We know that winning is about more than just medals or podium finishes - it’s about pride, self-confidence and friendship.

The campaign featured Special Olympics athletes, coaches and volunteers taking a stand on ‘Our Podium’ as a symbol of the true spirit of sport. Because for us, sport is about more than rewarding a single individual. It’s about creating an inclusive community in which we elevate each other.

The campaign ran across digital platforms for 3 months, amassing more than 5 million impressions and resulted in athlete and volunteer registration interest from thousands of individuals across the country.

## Hill Day 2022

This April marked an important milestone for Special Olympics Canada as the Government of Canada announced the inclusion of Special Olympics Canada in the 2022 federal budget. This support included a renewal of \$1.8M in incremental funding, bringing their total annual commitment to \$3.8M on an ongoing basis.



The announcement of this sustainable funding lays the groundwork and provides stability for the 12 Provincial/Territorial Chapters that deliver Special Olympics programs across Canada.

This big win for the Special Olympics movement would not have been possible if it weren't for the efforts of staff, volunteers, athletes and families across the country, who rallied their communities and organized more than 150 impactful conversations with MPs and Senators.

## Program Development Highlights

### Launch of Special Olympics Canada Long Term Athlete Development 2.0 (LTAD 2.0)

#### Commitment to Safe Sport

Developed a suite of new policies to adhere with updated Safe Sport guidelines and completed our National commitment to Safe Sport training of all staff and Board members.

#### Young Athletes Virtual Program Delivery

Developed an 'At Home Youth Kit' during the pandemic consisting of instructional videos, activity booklets and physical equipment to give families the tools to continue developing their child's physical literacy skills from home.



### Virtual Special Smiles

In collaboration with CSDH, Special Olympics Canada launched a program for athletes to receive virtual dental health screenings from home.

### Concussion Awareness

Launched 'Making Headway in Special Olympics' in collaboration with the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC), an online learning tool for coaches and volunteers that is available through the Locker. An athlete concussion guide and instructional video were also developed to provide further education on the signs, symptoms and treatment of concussions

## Special Olympics Team Canada 2022

After 2 years of virtual training due to a global pandemic, and the ultimate cancellation of the Games due to geopolitical turmoil, no Special Olympics Team Canada has seen more obstacles – each faced with determination, perseverance and resiliency.

At the end of their more than 2-year journey, the Team attended Training Camp in Toronto. The weekend marked the first time all 161 athletes, coaches and mission staff could gather as a team. We decided to film that weekend to cement the Team's place in history.

'Meet the Resilient' is a documentary that follows the longest-serving Special Olympics Team Canada – the only Special Olympics Team Canada that never had their moment on the world stage, but showed the world that resiliency is a muscle they've been training their whole lives.

## National Awards Night 2021

Since 1989, Special Olympics Canada has honoured athletes and volunteers for remarkable achievements that contribute to and strengthen the Special Olympics movement across the country. Each year, achievements are recognized through a National Awards program that includes several distinct categories – athletes, teams, coaches, as well as operational and fundraising volunteers that contribute at both the local and national levels.

For the second year in a row, the Awards Night celebration took place virtually. The 33rd Special Olympics Canada National Awards Night was hosted by TSN on Thursday, December 2 by Vic Rauter and Special Olympics Quebec athlete, Sébastien Hamel-Bourdeau.

The live stream of the event announced 10 National Award Winners representing 6 of our Provincial/Territorial Chapters and garnered more than 10,000 views across TSN and RDS Facebook pages, YouTube channels and digital streaming platforms. Traditional media coverage of Award Winners

resulted in a reach of more than 800,000 – truly shining a light on the tremendous abilities and contributions of athletes, coaches and volunteers from our movement.




### REVENUE (2022)




AT HOME

Although we were unable to gather in person for the 2021 Special Olympics Canada LIMITLESS Gala, when it came to raising the critical funds that the gala provides for programming across Canada, our Special Olympics community and LIMITLESS supporters answered, "Challenge Accepted."

Co-presenting sponsors Deloitte and Sobeys maintained their sponsorship despite the cancellation of the event and matched all donations (up to \$170,000) made from other supporters in lieu of gala table purchases.



Virtual guests showed their support through Draft an Athlete, raising more than \$176,000. Thanks to this unwavering support, the LIMITLESS Gala raised \$1,055,900 in support of Special Olympics in Canada – at a challenging time when funds were needed most.
